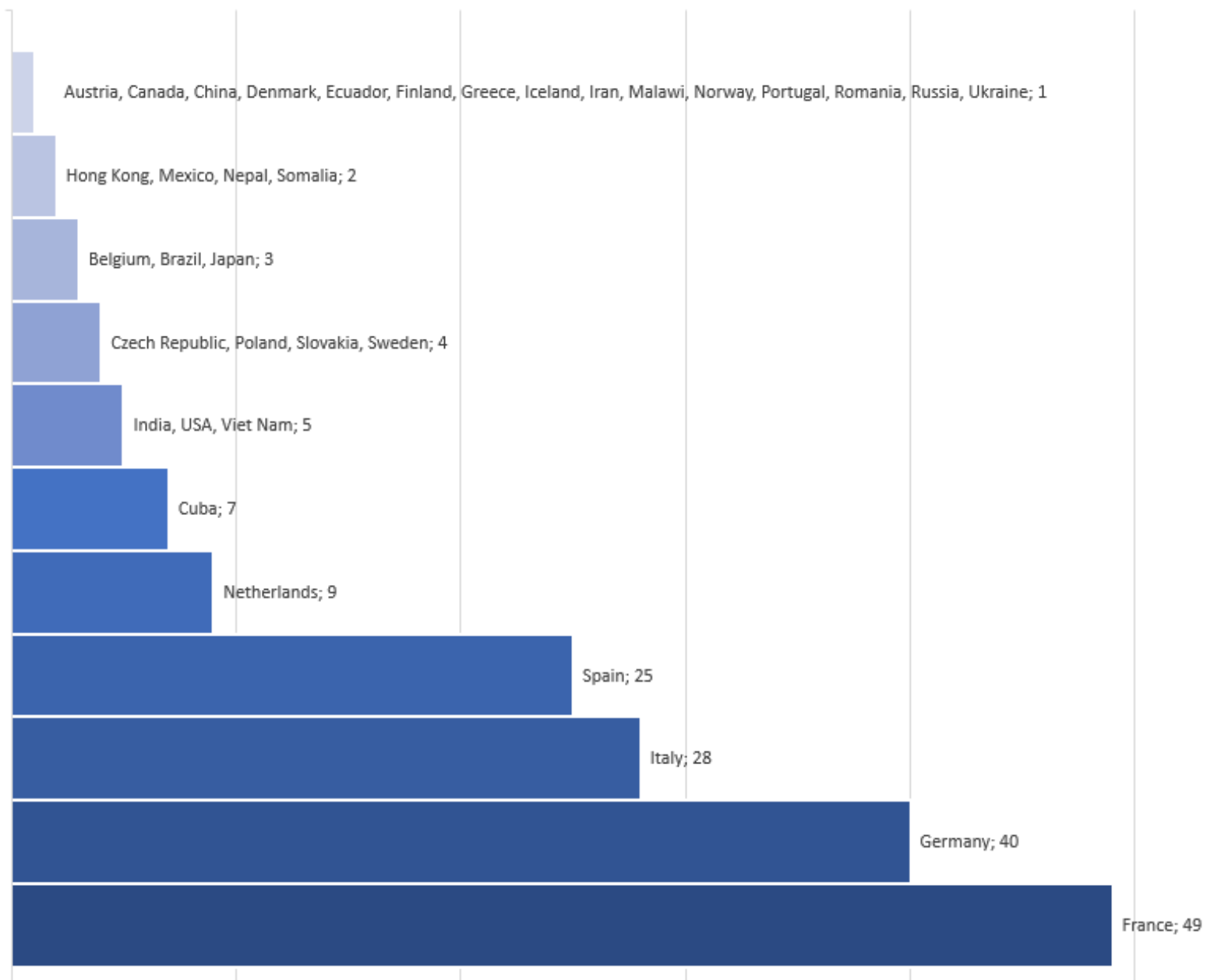

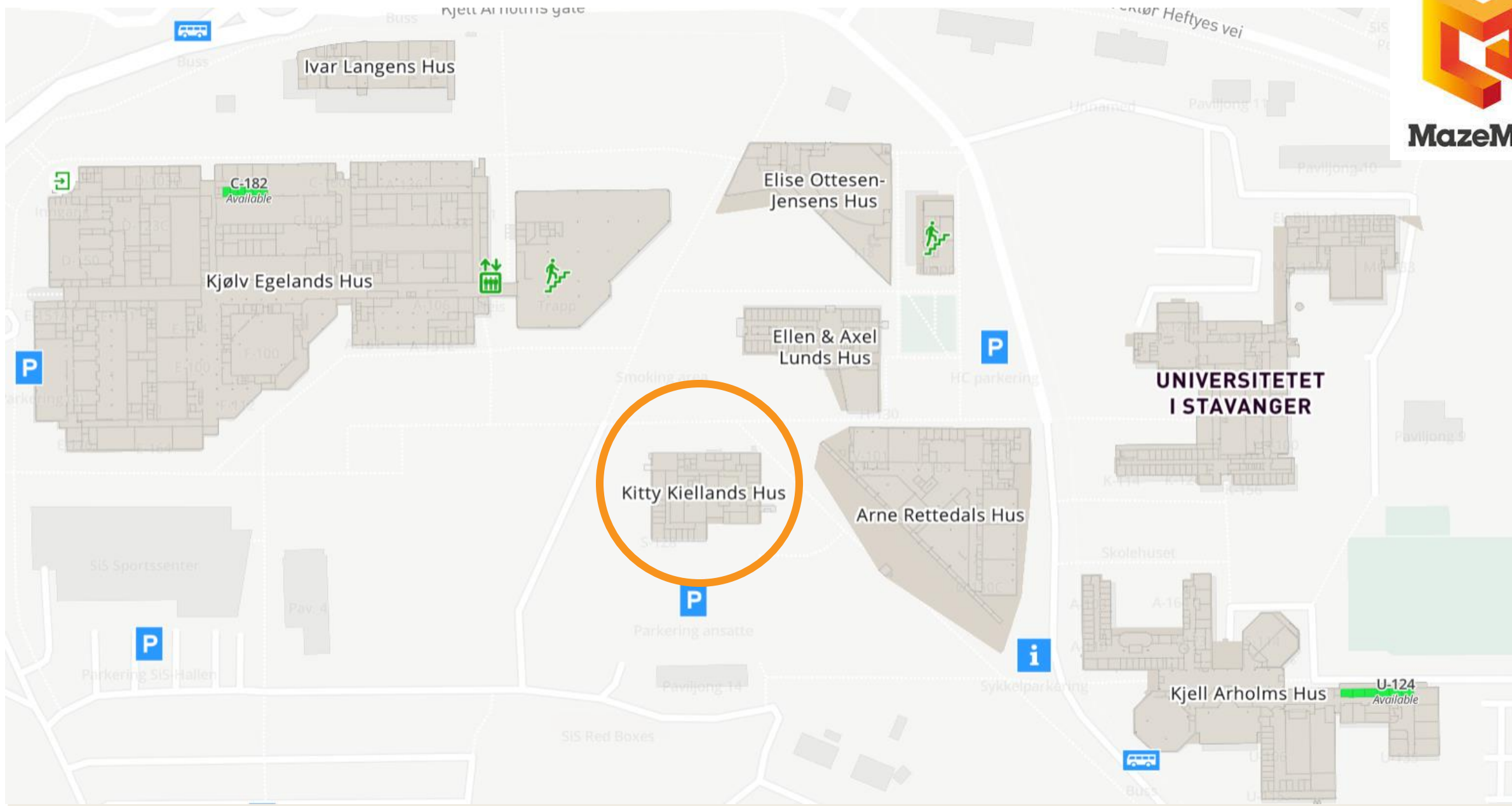

- Learning Agreement
- Confirmation of Arrival
 - Start-date should be the date of your first activity
 - Cannot be earlier than the start of the semester (12.08.24)
- Confirmation of Stay / Departure
 - Usually: End-date is the date of your final exam
 - Cannot be later than the end of the semester (20.12.24)

Tuberculosis test

- Mandatory for all students coming from/having spent 3 months in [high-risk areas/countries](#)
- International Office will soon send an invitation to a mandatory information meeting to all students who need to get tested
- Important to show up for scheduled test appointments.
The results will not affect your stay in Norway. Any treatment is free of charge
