

Supplementary rules for admission to Master in Sustainability Studies

This document is a translation of a legally binding document originally written in Norwegian. If a dispute arises as to the interpretation of this document, the Norwegian version takes precedence.

§1 - Scope

The Master degree in Sustainability Studies is a discipline based Master degree program, with a scope of 120 ECTS, cf. §3 in Regulations concerning Requirements for Master's Degrees established by the Ministry of Education and Research on 1 December 2005.

§2 – Admission requirements

§2-1 – Academic requirements:

Admission requires one of the following backgrounds:

- A bachelor's degree with a specialization of in one or more of the following subject areas or equivalent: history, hotel management, tourism management, social science, sociology, psychology, pedagogics, anthropology, law, political science, human and social geography, administration, economics or equivalent.

- Professional bachelor's degrees within the following disciplines qualify for admission: police, teacher education, social care and journalism.

§2-2 – Grade requirement:

Admission to this master's programme requires a minimum grade average comparable to a Norwegian C (according to ECTS Standards) in the bachelor's degree.

§2-3 – Admission committee

The Dean will form an admission committee. The committee must consist of at least one academic employee connected to the study programme, at least one administrative employee, and should also include student representatives. The committee considers applications based on special consideration and prior qualifications, applications with foreign education and which other education paths can be approved as equivalent.

§3 Entry into force

The supplementary rules will enter into force as from admission to the study year 2022/2023.
